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

From the composer:

Ragnarök is a story in Norse mythology that is supposed to bring about the end and rebirth of the world. During the battle between Gods and Giants the world tree, Yggdrasil, remains standing, and from it we see new life emerge. There are parallels between the natural disasters in Ragnarök and the 2012 fires in Colorado, and so this ancient text is woven into a contemporary poem about the Waldo Canyon fire that covered 29 square miles near Colorado Springs.

This mixture of ancient and contemporary poetry ties the work together, so we hear both English and Old Norse together in the singing of certain runes from the Elder Futhark (the oldest form of the runic alphabets). These runes foreshadow the drama to come, and musically they provide a textual backdrop against the narrative of the Völuspá text (this is the poem that includes the story of Ragnarök).

The music that accompanies "The Fires" has a resigned tone to it, but it also features a repetitive rising motion that not only represents rising smoke but also a hopeful determined outlook toward the future. At the end of the piece, this motive comes back in a major key, and indeed we hear hope as the earth returns to normal and nature resumes her course.

Takach has risen fast in the concert world. Applauded for his melodic lines and rich, intriguing harmonies, Takach has received commissions from the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, St. Olaf Band, Cantus, Pavia Winds, Lorelei Ensemble, VocalEssence, the DeBartolo Performing Arts Center, The Rose Ensemble, and numerous other organizations. His compositions have been performed on A Prairie Home Companion, The Boston Pops holiday tour, multiple All-State and festival programs and at venues such as the Library of Congress, Kennedy Center and Royal Opera House Muscat. He is a co-creator of the theatrical production of All is Calm: the Christmas Truce of 1914, by Peter Rothstein.

Takach studied music composition at St. Olaf College, Northfield, MN, and has frequent national work as a composer-in-residence, presenter, clinician and lecturer. He is a full-time composer and lives in Minneapolis with his wife and two sons.
