## Note from the composer

In the early stages of writing this piece I concluded that the simpler I kept the ${ }^{1} \mathrm{~m}$ sic, the closer it would be to the intention of Lebanese poet Khalil Gibran's amazing textlaboutthe stewardship of raising a child. In the writing I attempted to represent this by taking melodic idea and "growing" it one note at a time until it became the entire line of text; slow, repetitive development that eventually yields what is hopefully something beautiful. Not a bad metaphor foparenthood, I think.
