# Things I Didn't Know I Loved

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## Program Note:

"In Turkish poet Nazim Hikmet's semi-autobiographical poem, a man just released from prison looks out the window of a train. As he travels, he realizes that he has forgotten so many wonderful things in the world while he was away. He mentions quite a few specific memories in a stream of consciousness style, and the unifying element that links them together is the consistent lens of the train window. I wrote unique music for each of the different musings, so each memory has its own voice. Although this work is through-composed, the repeating half-step motive that emerges throughout the music conjures up the movement of the train and links all of the separate contemplations together. Wherever each memory takes us, we are always called back to the view through the train window. In the end it is clear that the narrator has not fallen back in love with these singular things—he has fallen in love with life itself."

I just remembered the stars I love them too Whether I'm floored watching them from below Or whether I'm flying at their side

Snow flashes in front of my eyes Both heavy wet steady snow and the dry whirling kind I didn't know I liked snow

I never knew I loved the sun Even when setting cherry-red as now In Istanbul too it sometimes sets in postcard colors But you aren't about to paint it that way I didn't know I loved the sea Except the Sea of Azov Or how much

I didn't know I loved clouds Whether I'm under or up above them whether they look like giants or shaggy white beasts moonlight strikes me I like it

I didn't know I liked rain Whether it falls like a fine net or splatters against the glass




my heart leaves me tangled up in a net or

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














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## Timothy C. Takach



Inspired by captivating narrative, speculative fiction and making better humans through art, the music of Timothy C. Takach is a mainstay in the concert world. Applauded for his melodic lines, thoughtful text choices and rich, intriguing harmonies, Takach has received commissions and performances from GRAMMY Award-winning ensembles Roomful of Teeth and the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Santa Fe Desert Chorale, the St. Olaf Band, Cantus, U.S. Army Field Band and Soldiers' Chorus, Lorelei Ensemble, VocalEssence, the DeBartolo Performing Arts Center, The Rose Ensemble, and numerous other organizations. His compositions have been performed on A Prairie Home Companion, The Boston Pops holiday tour, PBS, many All-State and festival programs and at venues such as the Library of Congress, Kennedy Center and Royal Opera House Muscat. He is a cocreator of the theatrical production of *All is Calm: the Christmas Truce of 1914*, by Peter Rothstein. Takach has been Composer in Residence for the Texas Boys Choir, The Singers – Minnesota Choral Artists, and True Concord Voices and Orchestra.

Takach's a cappella choral symphony Helios is "larger than life, as if the piece were accompanied by an orchestra" and is "complemented with brilliant visuals created by CandyStations" (Tucson.com). In 2023 his ballet *Unfashioned Creature* was

premiered in St. Paul, MN by the James Sewell Ballet. Takach was a co-founder, singer and Artistic Co-Director of the vocal ensemble Cantus and has frequent national work as a composer-in-residence, presenter, clinician and lecturer. He lives in Minneapolis with his wife and two sons.
